


1st Sunday of Lent Year B 5 March 2006

Dear Friends,

The main symbol for this Lent is the stark wood of the Cross on the sanctuary. It will be used as our Processional Cross, which replaces our beautiful, carved one for this liturgical season. We usually have only the two crosses in our church at the one time, and I think their placement is most appropriate. Placed on the back wall, the large crucified Christ, is very much 'among us', arms outstretched embracing us in our humanity, our suffering and fragility. We are then drawn to the altar, where we experience the fullness of the mystery of the Cross, by partaking of the heavenly banquet, our taste of eternal life. And this is depicted in our carved processional cross, echoing the acclamation" Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again" – as we with Him!

The stark empty wood of the Lenten cross can be a challenge to us, to walk closely with Jesus over these forty days. The Project Compassion theme is "compassion in action". Have we the passion, the enthusiasm of Jesus to make a difference in our hurting and suffering world?
