
Easter Sunday

Look to heaven

This is a story of two of our children. Sally was born on 25 November 1970 and Greg had been church below the rooftops born the previous year on 10 August. Sally was our sixth child when our eldest was only six. That was the time when mothers were minding their

children, baking their biscuits, making their clothes and feeling very sorry that Russian mothers had to leave their children in community nurseries to go to work.

Our world fell apart when Sally was two years old and she was diagnosed with leukaemia. When she was in remission we moved to the country town where I had been born and where my husband had employment. We were hoping for a less hectic life. Many long stays in Brisbane ensued and much treatment.

Sally's most favourite possession was 'dolly'. I made her dollies and if one wore out or got lost there'd be a new one next morning. 'Dolly' was her last word before she passed away on 22 November 1975.

Greg asked one day when we were going to bring Sally home. He was only six and had lost his little sister. It was hard to understand she'd gone to Heaven. Turn the calendar forward to 17 November 1998 and I am sitting with Greg as he is about to depart this life. Greg had been battling cancer for twenty months. I was lucky he could be at home with me as I had promised he would be. We talked about Sally and I told him he'd see her in Heaven...

God gives strength and life

...When he died I just sat quietly with him. I said, 'Greg, we have a secret. No-one knows you have gone.' It was a precious time. Greg was now with his little sister.

Why do I want to tell you this story? Because I want people to know what strength God gives to His people. We are still here. The family members are still living their lives. Sometimes we hear that if you have faith all will be healed. Not everyone can be healed. God gives his people strength and I want you to know that. Sure our hearts have been broken, but by God's wonderful power we are still here. There is no way we would be without His divine support. (Maureen)

Through the resurrection of his Son God has granted us healing. May he fulfil his promises, and bless you with eternal life. (Solemn Blessing)

Mary Magdalen saw him

We must reflect upon the ardent love in the heart of Mary Magdalen, who would not leave the Lord's grave, even after his own disciples had gone away. She continued seeking him whom she could not find; in tears she kept searching; and, afire with love, she yearned for him whom she believed had been removed. Thus it happened that she alone saw him, she who had remained behind to seek him... She had already sought and found nothing. But she persevered, and therefore found the Pope St Gregory the Great (c.540-604) object of her love. (See John 20:11-18)



Transformed by Easter

Christian history reaches its crescendo point in the Resurrection of Jesus. The risen Jesus is the final revelation of the heart of God - a God who teaches love rather than hate, forgiveness rather than blame, non-violence rather than violence.

The Resurrection of Jesus tells us that there is no victory through domination. There is no such thing as triumph by force. By his life, death and resurrection Jesus stops the cycle of violence and challenges the notion of dominating power. This is a power that seeks to change things from the top down, from the outside in. Instead, Jesus invites us to relational or spiritual power, where we are not just changed but transformed. And not transformed from the top down but from the bottom up, not from the outside in but from the inside out. Transformed into God.
